She played with horses to her delight,



Microscopes By Jackson Roeder

A microscope is a tool that you use if you want to see something up close. Zacharias Janssen invented the microscope in 1595. There are several different varieties and uses of microscopes.

There are several different varieties of microscopes. Some microscopes use light. For example, stereoscopic microscopes are used for examining larger things but their magnification can't exceed 50 times. Another example is the compound light microscope. The compound light microscope, which has two lenses, can magnify up to 1000 to 2000 times! There are also some microscopes that don't use light. The electron microscope is a type of microscope that is powered by electrons. If you imagined that 2000 times of magnification was a lot, the electron microscope can go from 300,000 times to 1,000,000 times magnification!

Microscopes have a sizable amount of uses. One use of microscopes is to look at dissected things. Since magnifying glasses can't magnify well, detectives also sometimes use microscopes to examine clues for dust, microorganisms, body fluids and other clues that might help them. Geologists use microscopes to study rocks and minerals closely. Another profession which uses microscopes is engineers. They use them for finding out surface properties and structures of metals. Microscopes are useful in many people's lives.



My favorite coral reef creature is the Frogfish. The Frogfish has the fastest attack of any animal at a 6 millisecond strike to a fish its own size. The Frogfish has lumpy skin to blend in with coral so it can either lie in wait for an unsuspecting fish to eat, or to hide from predators. Another cool feature the Frogfish has is a lure for prey to follow. It acts as a shrimp, when the fish sees the lure it goes closer, closer, even closer, GULP! Down the hatch! The Frogfish is a small creature with its size maxing out at 1 ½ feet in length.

My favorite deep sea creature is the Sperm Whale. It has the largest brain of any mammal species. Sperm Whales can dive up to 14,000 meters below the surface before running out of air. The Sperm Whale can hold its breath for 110 minutes. The Sperm Whale's favorite food is any type of squid, but its favorite type of squid to eat is the Colossal Squid. The Colossal Squid is the largest squid of our time. The Sperm Whale has a sonar adaptation so the mother Sperm Whale can find its calf in the huge ocean. 





Wonders of the Deep Sea

There are many animals in the shallower parts of the ocean that we know much about, but the most interesting are the ones we know least of. Rather recently, a submersible has been invented that can go to amazing depths to learn more about these interesting creatures. It went to Mariana Trench, the deepest point in any of the oceans, to learn about the animals there.

A lot of these creatures are bioluminescent. That means that they can make lights with their bodies. That kind of animal usually is see-through, so that their prey only sees the light and goes toward it. Then chomp, there the prey goes. Lights are also used to communicate.

All of these animals are very interesting. One kind of fish, called macropinna, has eyes that can rotate inside their clear shield. It feeds on the prey of a kind of colony called a siphonophore. A siphonophore looks like a long string of little balls. They each have a job, like ants in a colony. They have tentacles to trap prey. The macropinna wait, with their eyes rotated up, until the siphonophore catches something. Then they rotate their eyes down, to where they can see what they are eating, and then grab the food.

Down in the deep, there also are squid that carry their egg sac around with them, the only species of squid that does. There are shrimp, crabs, and flatfish that can stand amazing heat and volcanic activity. The sulferic gases trap and poison other fish, which float down to where the flatfish can eat them. Beautiful, bioluminescent jelly-fish float around, blinking and flashing. Eels with huge jaws swim through the dark water, waiting to catch smaller fish with their flashing lights. Orange Roughy, now with their numbers plummeting because of fishermen overfishing, swim along the bottom of the sea. Shining and blinking, lights are everywhere.

This is some of what someone in a submersible would see. Scientists are always making discoveries and taking specimens. I wonder what they'll find next in that wonderful, mysterious, dark world.
